Mr. SAXTON (for himself and Mr. DELLUMS) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

## RESOLUTION

Concerning the situation in Rwanda.

Whereas 2,000,000 refugees fled in a mass exodus from the nation of Rwanda;

Whereas the situation in Rwanda has been characterized as the greatest refugee crisis in modern times;

Whereas thousands of Rwandan refugees are dying due to disease and starvation;

Whereas over 1,200 tons of food a day and 1,000,000 gallons of water are reported to be required to stem death and sickness among the Rwandan refugees;

Whereas the American people and the United States Government have historically responded to human tragedies through the delivery of food, medicine, and other life-sustaining supplies; and

Whereas the United States' ability to transport and deliver critically-needed humanitarian aid to Rwanda and future crises is hampered by a declining airlift fleet: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the House of Rep-  
2       resentatives that the United States Government should  
3       maintain a commitment to mobilize, in concert with the  
4       United Nations and the country's allies, to provide nec-  
5       essary aid to relieve the human suffering resulting from  
6       the Rwandan crisis and to take active steps to ensure that  
7       the United States possesses the military assets needed to  
8       accomplish this vital undertaking.
