## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (S. 1357) to reaffirm and clarify the Federal relationships of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians and the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians as distinct federally recognized Indian tribes, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-

1 ation of the bill (S. 1357) to reaffirm and clarify the Fed-  
2 eral relationships of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of  
3 Odawa Indians and the Little River Band of Ottawa Indi-  
4 ans as distinct federally recognized Indian tribes, and for  
5 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-  
6 pensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill  
7 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-  
8 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of  
9 the Committee on Natural Resources. After general debate  
10 the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-  
11 minute rule. Each section of the bill shall be considered  
12 as read. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for  
13 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill  
14 to the House with such amendments as may have been  
15 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as  
16 ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final pas-  
17 sage without intervening motion except one motion to  
18 recommit.
