RESOLUTION

Waiving points of order against a further conference report to accompany the bill (H.R. 3355) to amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to allow grants to increase police presence, to expand and improve cooperative efforts between law enforcement agencies and members of the community to address crime and disorder problems, and otherwise to enhance public safety.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider a further conference report
3 to accompany the bill (H.R. 3355) to amend the Omnibus
4 Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to allow
5 grants to increase police presence, to expand and improve
6 cooperative efforts between law enforcement agencies and
7 members of the community to address crime and disorder
8 problems, and otherwise to enhance public safety. All
9 points of order against the conference report and against
10 its consideration are waived. The conference report shall
11 be considered as read. The conference report shall be de-
12 batable for eighty minutes, with twenty minutes controlled
13 by the chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary, forty
14 minutes controlled by the ranking minority member of the
15 Committee on the Judiciary, and twenty minutes con-
16 trolled by Representative Castle of Delaware. The previous
17 question shall be considered as ordered on the conference
18 report to final adoption without intervening motion except
19 one motion to recommit, which may contain instructions
20 only if offered by Representative Michel of Illinois or his
21 designee.
