Mr. BONIOR, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2866) to provide for the sound management and protection of Redwood forest areas in Humboldt County, California, by adding certain lands and waters to the Six Rivers National Forest and by including a portion of such lands in the national wilderness preservation system.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 2866) to provide for the sound man-
3 agement and protection of Redwood forest areas in Hum-
4 boldt County, California, by adding certain lands and wa-
5 ters to the Six Rivers National Forest and by including
6 a portion of such lands in the national wilderness preser-
7 vation system. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-
8 pensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill
9 and shall not exceed one hour, with thirty minutes equally
10 divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-
11 nority member of the Committee on Agriculture and thirty
12 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman
13 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Natu-
14 ral Resources. After general debate the bill shall be consid-
15 ered for amendment under the five-minute rule. Each sec-
16 tion shall be considered as read. Points of order against
17 provisions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 5(a)
18 of rule XXI are waived. Except as provided in section 2
19 of this resolution, no amendment shall be in order except
20 those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules ac-
21 companying this resolution. Each amendment may be of-
22 fered only in the order printed in the report, may be of-
23 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall
24 be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time spec-
25 ified in the report equally divided and controlled by the

1 proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-
2 ment except as specified in the report, and shall not be
3 subject to a demand for division of the question in the
4 House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of
5 order against the amendments printed in the report are
6 waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
7 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill
8 to the House with such amendments as may have been
9 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-
10 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
11 without intervening motion except one motion to recom-
12 mit.

13 SEC. 2. It shall be in order at any time for the chair-
14 man of the Committee on Agriculture or a designee to
15 offer amendments en bloc consisting of amendments print-
16 ed in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying
17 this resolution or germane modifications of any such
18 amendment. Amendments en bloc offered pursuant to this
19 section shall be considered as read (except that modifica-
20 tions shall be reported), shall be debatable for ten minutes
21 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
22 ing minority member of the Committee on Agriculture or
23 their designees, shall not be subject to amendment, and
24 shall not be subject to a demand for division of the ques-
25 tion in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. All

1 points of order against such amendments en bloc are
2 waived. For the purpose of inclusion in such amendments
3 en bloc, an amendment printed in the form of a motion
4 to strike may be modified to the form of a germane per-
5 fecting amendment to the text originally proposed to be
6 stricken. The original proponent of an amendment in-
7 cluded in such amendments en bloc may insert a state-
8 ment in the Congressional Record immediately before the
9 disposition of the amendments en bloc.
