Mr. DELLUMS submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

RESOLUTION

Providing amounts from the contingent fund of the House for expenses of investigations and studies by the Committee on Armed Services in the first session of the One Hundred Third Congress.

1 *Resolved*, That (a) expenses of investigations and
2 studies by the Committee on Armed Services (hereinafter
3 in this resolution referred to as the “Committee”), includ-
4 ing expenses for—

5 (1) procurement of consultant services under
6 section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act
7 of 1946; and

1 (2) provision of assistance for members of pro-
2 fessional staff in obtaining specialized training under
3 section 202(j) of such Act;

4 there shall be paid out of the contingent fund of the House
5 not more than \$2,650,233.

6 (b) Not more than \$40,000 of the amount specified
7 in subsection (a) may be used for consultant services re-
8 ferred to in paragraph (1) of such subsection and not more
9 than \$8,000 of such amount may be used for specialized
10 training referred to in paragraph (2) of such subsection.

11 SEC. 2. Payments under this resolution shall be made
12 on vouchers authorized by the Committee, signed by the
13 Chairman of the Committee, and approved by the Commit-
14 tee on House Administration.

15 SEC. 3. Amounts shall be available under this resolu-
16 tion for investigations and studies carried out during the
17 period beginning at noon on January 3, 1993, and ending
18 immediately before noon on January 3, 1994.

19 SEC. 4. Amounts made available under this resolution
20 shall be expended in accordance with regulations pre-
21 scribed by the Committee on House Administration.

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
