## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of Congress with respect to certain court orders relating to the desegregation of schools.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of Congress that each  
3 court of the United States currently having in force any  
4 decree or other order respecting the desegregation of  
5 schools should, if the decree or order has been in effect  
6 for more than three years, reconsider that order to deter-  
7 mine whether the means chosen to achieve desegregation  
8 are currently effective in the light of any changed facts  
9 and to make any modifications necessary, consistent with
