CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

Whereas the Member's and Family Room is an official entity
of the House of Representatives, administratively under
the Office of the Clerk of the House;

Whereas the purpose of the Member's and Family Room is to facilitate family life in congressional families, and to promote collegial relationships among the sitting Members of Congress; and

Whereas a family picnic on the Capitol grounds would promote the purposes of the Member's and Family Room: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF FIRST ANNUAL CONGRES-**
4 **SIONAL FAMILY PICNIC ON CAPITOL**
5 **GROUNDS.**

6 The Advisory Board of the Member's and Family
7 Room (in this resolution referred to as the "Advisory
8 Board") shall be permitted to sponsor an event, the first
9 annual Congressional Family Picnic, on the Capitol
10 grounds on July 30, 1996, or on such other date as the
11 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Presi-
12 dent pro tempore of the Senate may jointly designate.

13 **SEC. 2. CONDITIONS.**

14 The event to be carried out under this resolution shall
15 be arranged under conditions to be prescribed by the Ar-
16 chitect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board.

17 **SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**

18 For the purposes of this resolution, the Advisory
19 Board is authorized to erect upon the Capitol grounds,
20 subject to the approval of the Architect of the Capitol,

1 such structures and equipment (including cooking equip-
2 ment) as may be required for the event to be carried out
3 under this resolution.

4 **SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.**

5 The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
6 Board are authorized to make any such additional ar-
7 rangements that may be required to carry out the event
8 under this resolution.
