Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the Firefighter Challenge.

Mr. WELDON of Pennsylvania submitted the following concurrent resolution;  
which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

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## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the  
Firefighter Challenge.

Whereas the Firefighter Challenge launches its fourth year of competition involving over 4,000 firefighters from the United States, Canada, and Australia;

Whereas the Firefighter Challenge will conduct over 23 competitions throughout the United States, Canada, and Australia;

Whereas the Firefighter Challenge demonstrates the fitness and readiness of career and volunteer firefighters to people of all ages;

Whereas the Firefighter Challenge pays tribute to the valor and dedication of the American Fire Service in preserving life and property; and

Whereas the Firefighter Challenge commences a day of activities in Washington, District of Columbia, honoring firefighters which culminates with the National Fire and Emergency Services Dinner, hosted by the Congressional Fire Services Institute: Now, therefore, be it

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR THE FIRE-**  
4 **FIGHTER CHALLENGE.**

5        The Congressional Fire Services Institute shall be  
6 permitted to host a public event on the Capitol Grounds  
7 during the period beginning on April 24, 1995, and ending  
8 on April 27, 1995, or during such other period as the  
9 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Presi-  
10 dent pro tempore of the Senate may jointly designate.

11 **SEC. 2. CONDITIONS.**

12        The event to be carried out under this resolution shall  
13 be free of admission charge to the public and arranged  
14 not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under condi-  
15 tions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and  
16 the Capitol Hill Police Board; except that the Congres-  
17 sional Fire Services Institute shall assume full responsibil-  
18 ity for all expenses and liabilities incident to all activities  
19 associated with the event.

1 **SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**

2 For the purposes of this resolution, the Congressional  
3 Fire Services Institute is authorized to erect upon the  
4 Capitol grounds, subject to the approval of the Architect  
5 of the Capitol, such stage, sound amplification devices,  
6 and other related structures and equipment as may be  
7 required for the event to be carried out under this  
8 resolution.

9 **SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.**

10 The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Hill Po-  
11 lice Board are authorized to make such additional ar-  
12 rangements as may be required to carry out the event  
13 under this resolution.

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
