Mr. DAVIS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee
on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Lloyd B. Gamble.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS.**

4 (a) PAYMENT.—The Secretary of the Treasury shall
5 pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise ap-
6 propriated, to Lloyd B. Gamble of Fairfax, Virginia, the
7 sum of \$253,488.

8 (b) BASIS.—The payment required by subsection (a)
9 shall be to compensate Lloyd B. Gamble for the injuries
10 sustained by him as a result of the administration to him,
11 without his knowledge, of lysergic acid diethylamide by
12 United States Army personnel in 1957.

1 **SEC. 2. SATISFACTION OF CLAIMS.**

2 The payment made pursuant to section 1 shall be in
3 full satisfaction of all claims Lloyd B. Gamble may have
4 against the United States for any injury described in such
5 section.

6 **SEC. 3. INELIGIBILITY FOR ADDITIONAL BENEFITS.**

7 Upon payment of the sum referred to in section 1,
8 Lloyd B. Gamble shall not be eligible for any compensa-
9 tion or benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs
10 or the Department of Defense for any injury described in
11 such section.

12 **SEC. 4. LIMITATION OF AGENTS AND ATTORNEYS FEES.**

13 It shall be unlawful for an amount of more than 10
14 percent of the amount paid pursuant to section 1 to be
15 paid to or received by any agent or attorney for any service
16 rendered to Lloyd B. Gamble in connection with the bene-
17 fits provided by this Act. Any person who violates this sec-
18 tion shall be guilty of an infraction and shall be subject
19 to a fine in the amount provided in title 18, United States
20 Code.
