AN ACT

To transfer a parcel of land to the Taos Pueblo Indians
of New Mexico.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. LAND TRANSFER.**

4 (a) TRANSFER.—The parcel of land described in sub-
5 section (b) is hereby transferred without consideration to
6 the Secretary of the Interior to be held in trust for the
7 Pueblo de Taos. Such parcel shall be a part of the Pueblo
8 de Taos Reservation and shall be managed in accordance
9 with section 4 of the Act of May 31, 1933 (48 Stat. 108)
10 (as amended, including as amended by Public Law 91–
11 550 (84 Stat. 1437)).

1 (b) LAND DESCRIPTION.—The parcel of land re-
2 ferred to in subsection (a) is the land that is generally
3 depicted on the map entitled “Lands transferred to the
4 Pueblo of Taos—proposed” and dated September 1994,
5 comprises 764.33 acres, and is situated within sections 25,
6 26, 35, and 36, Township 27 North, Range 14 East, New
7 Mexico Principal Meridian, within the Wheeler Peak Wil-
8 derness, Carson National Forest, Taos County, New Mex-
9 ico.

10 (c) CONFORMING BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENTS.—The
11 boundaries of the Carson National Forest and the Wheeler
12 Peak Wilderness are hereby adjusted to reflect the trans-
13 fer made by subsection (a).

14 (d) RESOLUTION OF OUTSTANDING CLAIMS.—The
15 Congress finds and declares that, as a result of the enact-
16 ment of this Act, the Taos Pueblo has no unresolved equi-
17 table or legal claims against the United States on the
18 lands to be held in trust and to become part of the Pueblo
19 de Taos Reservation under this section.
