Mr. BILIRAKIS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend the Act of September 30, 1961, to exclude professional baseball from the antitrust exemption applicable to certain television contracts.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Baseball Antitrust
5 Restoration Amendment of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS.**

7 The Act of September 30, 1961 (15 U.S.C. 1291–
8 1294) is amended—

9 (1) in the first section by striking “baseball,”
10 each place it appears,

1 (2) in sections 4 and 6 by striking “baseball,”
2 each place it appears, and

3 (3) by adding at the end the following:

4 “SEC. 7. The antitrust laws referred to in section 1
5 shall apply with respect to joint agreements of the kind
6 described in such section entered into by or among persons
7 engaging in or conducting the organized professional team
8 sport of baseball.”.

9 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLICATION OF AMENDMENTS.**

10 (a) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—Except as provided in sub-
11 section (b), this Act and the amendments made by this
12 Act shall take effect on the date of the enactment of this
13 Act.

14 (b) **APPLICATION OF AMENDMENTS.**—With respect
15 to joint agreements entered into before the date of the
16 enactment of this Act, the amendments made by section
17 2 shall not apply until the expiration of the 1-year period
18 beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
