A BILL

To provide an exemption for small cargo tank vehicles of 3,500 gallons or less, transporting petroleum products, from certain hazardous material transportation regulations.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Hazardous Materials
5 Regulatory Relief Act of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. CARGO TANK EXEMPTION.**

7 The Secretary of Transportation shall exclude from
8 the provisions of part 180 of title 49 of the Code of Fed-

1 eral Regulations, any cargo tank vehicle of 3500 gallons
2 or less of capacity, used to transport petroleum products
3 in intrastate or interstate transportation within 100 air
4 miles of the principal place of business of the owner or
5 lessee of the vehicle.
