A BILL

To amend the Trade Act of 1974 to improve the provision of trade readjustment allowances during breaks in training, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Trade Adjustment As-
5 sistance Program Improvement Act of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROVISION OF TRADE READJUSTMENT ALLOW-**
7 **ANCES DURING BREAKS IN TRAINING.**

8 Section 233(f) of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C.
9 2293(f)) is amended by striking “14 days” and inserting
10 “45 days”.

1 **SEC. 3. TRANSITIONAL ADJUSTMENT ASSISTANCE PRO-**
2 **GRAM.**

3 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 250(d)(3)(B)(i) of the
4 Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2331(d)(3)(B)(i)) is
5 amended by striking “of such worker’s initial unemploy-
6 ment compensation benefit period” and inserting “after
7 such worker’s most recent qualifying separation”.

8 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to workers covered
10 under a certification issued under section 250(c) of the
11 Trade Act of 1974 on or after the date of the enactment
12 of this Act.
