A BILL

To repeal the provision of law under which pay for Members of Congress is automatically adjusted.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Congressional Pay
5 Accountability Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (2) of section 601(a)
8 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C.
9 31) is repealed.

1 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section 601(a)(1)
2 of such Act is amended—

3 (1) by striking “(a)(1)” and inserting “(a)”;

4 (2) by redesignating subparagraphs (A), (B),
5 and (C) as paragraphs (1), (2), and (3), respectively;
6 and

7 (3) by striking “, as adjusted by paragraph (2)
8 of this subsection”.
