Mrs. MINK of Hawaii introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Fanie Phily Mateo Angeles.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That, notwithstanding any provision of the Immigration
4 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Fanie Phily
5 Mateo Angeles shall be held and considered to have been
6 lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent resi-
7 dence as of the date of the enactment of this Act upon
8 payment of the required visa fee. Upon the granting of
9 permanent residence to such alien as provided for in this
10 Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer
11 to reduce by the proper number, during the current fiscal
12 year or the fiscal year next following, the total number

1 of immigrant visas which are made available to natives
2 of the country of the alien's birth under section 203(a)
3 of such Act, or if applicable, the total number of immi-
4 grant visas which are made available to natives of the
5 country of the alien's birth under section 202(e) of such
6 Act.
