Mr. ROHRBACHER (for himself and Mr. HAMILTON) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To provide authority for the extension of nondiscriminatory (most-favored-nation) trade treatment to Cambodia.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF NONDISCRIMINATORY TREAT-**
4 **MENT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
6 sion of law, nondiscriminatory treatment (most-favored-
7 nation treatment) applies to the products of Cambodia.

8 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—General Note 3(b)
9 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States
10 is amended by striking “Kampuchea”.

1 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 Section 1(a) and the amendment made by section
3 1(b) apply with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn
4 from warehouse for consumption when an agreement be-
5 tween the United States of America and the Kingdom of
6 Cambodia on trade relations and intellectual property
7 rights protection enters into force.

8 **SEC. 3. CONGRESSIONAL AND PRESIDENTIAL REVIEW OF**
9 **HUMAN RIGHTS.**

10 (a) If Congress mandates such action through legisla-
11 tion the President shall revoke most-favored-nation for
12 Cambodia, otherwise.

13 (b) The President of the United States may suspend
14 most-favored-nation treatment for Cambodia if they fail
15 to meet a standard set by the President.
