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## A BILL

To prohibit the designation as a beneficiary developing country under the Generalized System of Preference any country that engages in certain actions regarding nuclear weapons, nuclear weapon components and nuclear weapon design information.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. BENEFICIARY COUNTRY DESIGNATION.**

4 Section 502(b) of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C.  
5 2462(b)) is amended—

6 (1) by striking out “and” at the end of para-  
7 graph (6);

1           (2) by striking out the period at the end of  
2 paragraph (7) and inserting “, and”; and

3           (3) by inserting after paragraph (7) the follow-  
4 ing:

5           “(8) if—

6                 “(A) such country, after the date of the  
7 enactment of this paragraph, transfers to a  
8 non-nuclear-weapon state—

9                     “(i) a nuclear explosive device, or

10                    “(ii) any—

11                         “(I) nuclear weapons device com-  
12 ponent, or

13                         “(II) information that relates to  
14 the design of a nuclear explosive de-  
15 vice;

16           that the President determines to be important  
17 to, and known by such country to be intended  
18 by the recipient state for use in, the develop-  
19 ment of any nuclear explosive device; or

20                 “(B) such country (if a non-nuclear-weap-  
21 on state), after the date of the enactment of  
22 this paragraph—

23                     “(i) receives a nuclear explosive de-  
24 vice,

1                   “(ii) explodes a nuclear explosive de-  
2 vice, or

3                   “(iii) seeks and receives any—

4                   “(I) nuclear weapons device com-  
5 ponent, or

6                   “(II) information that relates to  
7 the design of a nuclear explosive de-  
8 vice,

9                   that the President determines to be important  
10 to, and intended by such country for use in, the  
11 development of a nuclear explosive device.”.

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
