A BILL

To amend the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 to authorize grants to coastal States for development of State coastal zone management program changes to support adoption of procedures and policies to evaluate and facilitate siting of certain aquaculture facilities in the coastal zone, and to establish in the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration a marine aquaculture development program to be known as the Nantucket Program.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Aquaculture Employ-
3 ment Investment Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. AQUACULTURE IN THE COASTAL ZONE.**

5 Section 309(a) of the Coastal Zone Management Act
6 of 1972 (16 U.S.C. 1456b(a)) is amended by adding at
7 the end the following new paragraph:

8 “(9) Adoption of procedures and policies to
9 evaluate and facilitate the siting of public and pri-
10 vate aquaculture facilities in the coastal zone which
11 will enable States to formulate, administer, and im-
12 plement strategic plans for marine aquaculture.”.

13 **SEC. 3. THE NANTUCKET PROGRAM.**

14 (a) ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM.—There is estab-
15 lished within the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Ad-
16 ministration a marine aquaculture development program
17 to be known as the Nantucket Program (in this section
18 referred to as the “Program”). The purpose of the Pro-
19 gram is to expand coastal economic opportunities through
20 activities that provide job training, technical assistance,
21 and employment opportunities in marine aquaculture,
22 transplant, and relay operations.

23 (b) GRANTS.—

24 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to the availability of
25 appropriations, the Secretary of Commerce (in this
26 section referred to as the “Secretary”) shall provide

1 grants under the Program to eligible coastal commu-
2 nities to develop marine aquaculture training and
3 support activities that contribute to achieving the
4 purpose of the Program set forth in subsection (a).

5 (2) GRANT ELIGIBILITY.—A coastal community
6 shall be an eligible coastal community under para-
7 graph (1) if the Secretary determines that the com-
8 munity meets the criteria issued under paragraph
9 (3).

10 (3) ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA.—The Secretary
11 shall issue guidelines and criteria for determining
12 whether a coastal community is an eligible coastal
13 community under paragraph (1).

14 (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For
15 grants under subsection (b) there are authorized to be ap-
16 propriated to the Secretary \$6,000,000 for each of fiscal
17 years 1996, 1997, and 1998.
