A BILL

To amend the General Educations Provisions Act expanding the exemption for the release of student records to comply with certain State statutes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PRIVACY RIGHTS.**

4 Section 444(b)(1)(E) of the General Education Pro-
5 vision Act (20 U.S.C. 1232q(b)(1)(E)) is amended to read
6 as follows:

7 “(E) State and local officials or authorities to
8 whom such information is specifically—

1 “(i) required to be reported or disclosed
2 pursuant to State statute adopted before No-
3 vember 19, 1974;

4 “(ii) allowed to be reported or disclosed
5 pursuant to State statute adopted before No-
6 vember 19, 1974, if the allowed reporting or
7 disclosure concerns the juvenile justice system
8 and such system’s ability to effectively serve the
9 student whose records are released; or

10 “(iii) allowed to be reported or disclosed
11 pursuant to State statute adopted after Novem-
12 ber 19, 1974, if—

13 “(I) the allowed reporting or disclo-
14 sure concerns the juvenile justice system
15 and such system’s ability to effectively
16 serve, prior to adjudication, the student
17 whose records are released; and

18 “(II) the officials and authorities to
19 whom such information is disclosed certify
20 in writing to the educational agency or in-
21 stitution that the information will not be
22 disclosed to any other party except as pro-
23 vided under State law without the prior

1 written consent of the parent of the stu-
2 dent.”.
