## A BILL

For the relief of the Sara, Jade, and Jordan Hutchings.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. ENTITLEMENT TO CHILDREN'S INSURANCE**  
4               **BENEFITS.**

5       (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-  
6       sion of law, the application for children's insurance bene-  
7       fits under section 202(d) of the Social Security Act (42  
8       U.S.C. 402(d)) filed by Barbara Ingmire on behalf of  
9       Sara, Jade, and Jordan Hutchings of Mulkilteo, Washing-  
10      ton, the surviving children of Peter Hutchings, shall be  
11      deemed to have been filed before September 30, 1986.

1 (b) PAYMENT.—Any benefits to which Sara, Jade,  
2 and Jordan Hutchings are entitled for the period prior  
3 to the date of enactment of this Act shall be paid to them  
4 in a lump sum.

5 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON AGENTS AND ATTORNEYS FEES.**

6 It shall be unlawful for an amount that exceeds 10  
7 percent of the sum described in section 1 to be paid to  
8 or received by any agent or attorney for any service ren-  
9 dered in connection with the benefits provided by this Act.  
10 Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of an  
11 infraction and shall be subject to a fine in the amount  
12 provided in title 18, United States Code.
