## A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to prohibit any member of the Armed Forces from being required to wear as part of the military uniform any indicia or insignia of the United Nations.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON REQUIREMENT FOR MEM-**  
2 **BERS OF THE ARMED FORCES TO WEAR UNI-**  
3 **FORM ITEMS OF THE UNITED NATIONS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 45 of title 10, United  
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the follow-  
6 ing new section:

7 **“§ 777. Insignia of United Nations: prohibition on re-**  
8 **quirement for wearing**

9 “No member of the armed forces may be required to  
10 wear as part of the uniform any badge, symbol, helmet,  
11 headgear, or other visible indicia or insignia which indi-  
12 cates (or tends to indicate) any allegiance or affiliation  
13 to or with the United Nations.”.

14 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections  
15 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding  
16 at the end the following new item:

“777. Insignia of United Nations: prohibition on requirement for wearing.”.
