Mr. STEARNS (for himself, Mr. HANCOCK, and Mr. HOSTETTLER) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To allow persons to carry concealed firearms in every State if they have been issued a license to do so by any State.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. RECIPROCITY OF STATE LICENSES TO CARRY**

4 **CONCEALED FIREARMS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 44 of title 18, United
6 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 926A
7 the following:

8 **“§ 926B. Interstate carrying of concealed firearms**

9 “Notwithstanding any provision of the law of any
10 State or political subdivision thereof, a person who is not

1 prohibited by Federal law from possessing, transporting,
2 shipping, or receiving a firearm and who is carrying a
3 valid license which is issued pursuant to the law of any
4 State and which permits the person to carry a concealed
5 firearm (other than a machinegun or destructive device)
6 shall be entitled to carry in any State a concealed firearm
7 (other than a machinegun or destructive device) that has
8 been shipped or transported in interstate or foreign com-
9 merce, in accordance with the terms of the license.”.

10 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
11 for such chapter is amended by inserting after the item
12 relating to section 926A the following:

“926B. Interstate carrying of concealed firearms.”.
