A BILL

To permit freon to be used for home, automobile, and agricultural air conditioning equipment.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CONTROL OF FREON FOR CERTAIN USES.**

4 (a) RESTRICTIONS ON EPA AUTHORITY.—Notwith-
5 standing title VI of the Clean Air Act, the Montreal Proto-
6 col, the Copenhagen Accords and all related international
7 agreements, the Administrator of the Environmental Pro-
8 tection Agency may not ban, phase out, or restrict the pro-
9 duction, importation, export, consumption, or use of CFC-
10 12 (freon) for use in automobile and agricultural air con-

1 ditioning equipment or HCFC-22 for use in residential
2 air conditioning equipment.

3 (b) INCONSISTENT EPA ACTIONS.—All rules, stand-
4 ards and other regulatory actions promulgated, published,
5 or otherwise issued by the Administrator of the Environ-
6 mental Protection Agency before the date of enactment
7 of this Act are repealed to the extent they impose a control
8 which is prohibited under subsection (a).
