# H. R. 2646

Mr. SHAW (for himself and Mr. GILCHREST) introduced the following bill;  
which was referred to the Committee on Agriculture

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## A BILL

To amend the sugar price support program in the Agricultural Act of 1949 to provide for a additional assessment with respect to raw cane sugar produced in the Everglades agricultural area in the State of Florida to finance land acquisition projects for the restoration of the Florida Everglades.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. MARKETING ASSESSMENT ON FLORIDA RAW**  
2 **CANE SUGAR TO PROMOTE RESTORATION OF**  
3 **FLORIDA EVERGLADES.**

4 Section 206 of the Agricultural Act of 1949 (7 U.S.C.  
5 1446g) is amended—

6 (1) by redesignating subsection (j) as sub-  
7 section (k); and

8 (2) by inserting after subsection (i) the follow-  
9 ing new subsection:

10 “(j) EVERGLADES AGRICULTURAL AREA ASSESS-  
11 MENT.—

12 “(1) ADDITIONAL ASSESSMENT.—In addition to  
13 the assessment required under subsection (i), the  
14 first processor of raw cane sugar processed from  
15 sugarcane grown in the Everglades agricultural area  
16 in the State of Florida or from sugarcane molasses  
17 derived from such sugarcane shall remit to the Com-  
18 modity Credit Corporation a nonrefundable market-  
19 ing assessment in an amount equal to 2 cents per  
20 pound of such raw cane sugar. Paragraphs (3), (4),  
21 and (5) of subsection (i) shall apply to the assess-  
22 ment required by this subsection.

23 “(2) ACCOUNT.—Funds collected under para-  
24 graph (1) shall be deposited in an account (to be  
25 known as the “Everglades Agricultural Area Ac-

1 count”, which shall remain available to the Secretary  
2 of Agriculture until expended.

3 “(3) USE OF ACCOUNT.—The Secretary of Ag-  
4 riculture shall use amounts in the account to make  
5 grants to the South Florida Water Management Dis-  
6 trict or other appropriate entity for the purpose of—

7 “(A) assisting the State of Florida in pur-  
8 chasing agricultural lands in the Everglades ag-  
9 ricultural area suitable for use in the restora-  
10 tion of the Florida Everglades; and

11 “(B) making modifications to such pur-  
12 chased lands designed to improve water storage  
13 and delivery.

14 “(4) PERIOD FOR ASSESSMENT.—The assess-  
15 ment required by this subsection shall apply to raw  
16 cane sugar processed from sugarcane grown in the  
17 Everglades agricultural area and marketed during  
18 the 1996 through 2000 fiscal years, except that the  
19 Secretary shall terminate the assessment if the pro-  
20 vision of price support for sugar beets and sugar-  
21 cane is terminated or prohibited.

22 “(5) EVERGLADES AGRICULTURAL AREA.—The  
23 Secretary shall determine the extent of the Ever-  
24 glades agricultural area in the State of Florida.”.

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
