Mr. FRANK of Massachusetts introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Economic and Educational Opportunities

A BILL

To authorize funds to further the public service mission of the Joseph W. Martin, Jr. Institute for Law and Society.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ASSISTANCE AUTHORIZED.**

4 In recognition of the legacy of public service with
5 which the former Speaker of the United States House of
6 Representatives, Joseph W. Martin, Jr., endowed the
7 American people and of the need for furthering the public
8 service mission of the Institute for Law and Society which
9 bears his name, the Secretary of Education is authorized
10 to provide funds in accordance with the provisions of this

1 Act to Stonehill College, located in North Easton, Massa-
2 chusetts. The Secretary is authorized to provide these
3 funds to Stonehill College to assist in the construction of
4 a facility and the sponsorship of programming which will
5 promote the coordination and availability of responsive
6 community-based services for the citizens of southeastern
7 Massachusetts.

8 **SEC. 2. CONDITIONS FOR ASSISTANCE.**

9 No payment may be made under this Act except upon
10 an application at such time, in such manner, and contain-
11 ing or accompanied by such information as the Secretary
12 may require in order to certify the amount of eligible
13 funds. All such payments may be used in the furtherance
14 of the public service mission of the Joseph W. Martin, Jr.
15 Institute for Law and Society, a national academic center
16 for scholarship and applied research on the development
17 of domestic and foreign policy during the career of Joseph
18 W. Martin, Jr., and a regional resource for education,
19 public policy, and community service.

20 **SEC. 3. DURATION OF ASSISTANCE.**

21 Funds appropriated pursuant to this Act shall be
22 made available to Stonehill College on or after October
23 1, 1995, and prior to the close of the fiscal year ending
24 September 30, 1999.

1 **SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATION.**

2 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
3 as may be necessary to carry out this Act for the fiscal
4 year ending September 30, 1996, and for each of the 3
5 succeeding fiscal years, except that the aggregate amount
6 so appropriated shall not exceed \$7,500,000. Funds ap-
7 propriated pursuant to this section shall remain available
8 until expended.
