Mr. JACOBS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on House Oversight

A BILL

To prohibit candidates for Congress from accepting multicandidate political committee contributions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION. 1. ACCEPTANCE OF MULTICANDIDATE POLITI-**
4 **CAL COMMITTEE CONTRIBUTIONS BY CAN-**
5 **DIDATES FOR CONGRESS AS UNLAWFUL.**

6 Title III of the Federal Election Campaign Act of
7 1971 (2 U.S.C. 431 et seq.) is amended by adding at the
8 end the following new section:

1 “ACCEPTANCE OF MULTICANDIDATE POLITICAL COMMIT-
2 TEE CONTRIBUTIONS BY CANDIDATES FOR CON-
3 GRESS AS UNLAWFUL

4 “SEC. 323. It shall be unlawful for any candidate for
5 the office of Senator or Representative in, or Delegate or
6 Resident Commissioner to, the Congress to accept con-
7 tributions from multicandidate political committees.”.
