Mr. PACKARD introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To terminate certain Border Patrol traffic checkpoint
operations in California.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**

4 The Congress makes the following findings:

5 (1) The Federal Government has responsibility
6 to secure the United States borders against the
7 entry of illegal aliens.

8 (2) It is far more effective and cost-efficient to
9 prevent the entry of illegal aliens at the border than

1 the apprehension and removal of illegal aliens after
2 entry.

3 (3) Border checkpoints located 60 miles inside
4 the United States border within the State of Califor-
5 nia are an inefficient and ineffective use of border
6 resources.

7 **SEC. 2. TERMINATION OF CERTAIN BORDER PATROL TRAF-**
8 **FIC CHECKPOINT OPERATIONS IN CALIFOR-**
9 **NIA.**

10 (a) TERMINATION.—Not later than 3 days after the
11 date of enactment of this Act, the Attorney General shall
12 terminate the Border Patrol traffic checkpoint operations
13 located in San Clemente, California, at interstate highway
14 5 and at Temecula, California, at interstate highway 15.

15 (b) RELOCATION OF RESOURCES.—Border Patrol
16 agents and resources located at such checkpoint oper-
17 ations terminated under subsection (a) shall be relocated
18 to the San Diego Border Patrol sector.
