A BILL

To amend the Armored Car Industry Reciprocity Act of 1993 to clarify certain requirements and to improve the flow of interstate commerce.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Armored Car Industry
3 Reciprocity Improvement Act of 1996”.

4 **SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION OF STATE RECIPROCITY OF WEAP-**
5 **ONS LICENSES ISSUED TO ARMORED CAR**
6 **COMPANY CREW MEMBERS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 3(a) of the Armored Car
8 Industry Reciprocity Act of 1993 (15 U.S.C. 5902(a)) is
9 amended to read as follows:

10 “(a) IN GENERAL.—If an armored car crew member
11 employed by an armored car company—

12 “(1) has in effect a license issued by the appro-
13 priate State agency (in the State in which such
14 member is primarily employed by such company) to
15 carry a weapon while acting in the services of such
16 company in that State, and such State agency meets
17 the minimum requirements under subsection (b);
18 and

19 “(2) has met all other applicable requirements
20 to act as an armored car crew member in the State
21 in which such member is primarily employed by such
22 company;

23 then such crew member shall be entitled to lawfully carry
24 any weapon to which such license relates and function as
25 an armored car crew member in any State while such
26 member is acting in the service of such company.”.

1 (b) MINIMUM STATE REQUIREMENTS.—Section 3(b)
2 of such Act (15 U.S.C. 5902(b)) is amended to read as
3 follows:

4 “(b) MINIMUM STATE REQUIREMENTS.—A State
5 agency meets the minimum State requirements of this
6 subsection if—

7 “(1) in issuing an initial weapons license to an
8 armored car crew member described in subsection
9 (a), the agency determines to its satisfaction that—

10 “(A) the crew member has received class-
11 room and range training in weapons safety and
12 marksmanship during the current year; and

13 “(B) the receipt or possession of a weapon
14 by the crew member would not violate Federal
15 law, determined on the basis of a criminal
16 record background check conducted during the
17 current year; and

18 “(2) in issuing a renewal of a weapons license
19 to an armored car crew member described in sub-
20 section (a), the agency determines to its satisfaction
21 that—

22 “(A) the crew member has received con-
23 tinuing training in weapons safety and marks-
24 manship from a qualified instructor for each

1 weapon that the crew member is licensed to
2 carry; and

3 “(B) the receipt or possession of a weapon
4 by the crew member would not violate Federal
5 law, as determined by the agency.”.

6 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

7 The amendments made by section 2 shall take effect
8 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.
