Res. 115) providing for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Thirteenth Congress; and for other purposes.

Mr. WOODALL, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 25) establishing the budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2014 and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2015 through 2023; providing for consideration of the resolution (H. Res. 115) providing for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Thirteenth Congress; and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 25) estab-
6 lishing the budget for the United States Government for
7 fiscal year 2014 and setting forth appropriate budgetary
8 levels for fiscal years 2015 through 2023. The first read-
9 ing of the concurrent resolution shall be dispensed with.
10 All points of order against consideration of the concurrent
11 resolution are waived. General debate shall not exceed four
12 hours, with three hours of general debate confined to the
13 congressional budget equally divided and controlled by the
14 chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on
15 the Budget and one hour of general debate on the subject
16 of economic goals and policies equally divided and con-
17 trolled by Representative Brady of Texas and Representa-
18 tive Carolyn Maloney of New York or their respective des-
19 ignees. After general debate the concurrent resolution
20 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute
21 rule. The concurrent resolution shall be considered as
22 read. No amendment shall be in order except those printed
23 in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying
24 this resolution. Each amendment may be offered only in
25 the order printed in the report, may be offered only by

1 a Member designated in the report, shall be considered
2 as read, and shall be debatable for the time specified in
3 the report equally divided and controlled by the proponent
4 and an opponent. All points of order against such amend-
5 ments are waived except that the adoption of an amend-
6 ment in the nature of a substitute shall constitute the con-
7 clusion of consideration of the concurrent resolution for
8 amendment. After the conclusion of consideration of the
9 concurrent resolution for amendment and a final period
10 of general debate, which shall not exceed 10 minutes
11 equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking
12 minority member of the Committee on the Budget, the
13 Committee shall rise and report the concurrent resolution
14 to the House with such amendment as may have been
15 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-
16 dered on the concurrent resolution and amendments there-
17 to to adoption without intervening motion except amend-
18 ments offered by the chair of the Committee on the Budg-
19 et pursuant to section 305(a)(5) of the Congressional
20 Budget Act of 1974 to achieve mathematical consistency.
21 The concurrent resolution shall not be subject to a demand
22 for division of the question of its adoption.

23 SEC. 2. On any legislative day during the period from
24 March 22, 2013, through April 8, 2013—

1 (a) the Journal of the proceedings of the previous day
2 shall be considered as approved;

3 (b) the Chair may at any time declare the House ad-
4 journed to meet at a date and time, within the limits of
5 clause 4, section 5, article I of the Constitution, to be an-
6 nounced by the Chair in declaring the adjournment; and

7 (c) bills and resolutions introduced during the period
8 addressed by this section shall be numbered, listed in the
9 Congressional Record, and when printed shall bear the
10 date of introduction, but may be referred by the Speaker
11 at a later time.

12 SEC. 3. The Speaker may appoint Members to per-
13 form the duties of the Chair for the duration of the period
14 addressed by section 2 of this resolution as though under
15 clause 8(a) of rule I.

16 SEC. 4. Each day during the period addressed by sec-
17 tion 2 of this resolution shall not constitute a calendar
18 day for purposes of section 7 of the War Powers Resolu-
19 tion (50 U.S.C. 1546).

20 SEC. 5. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
21 in order without intervention of any point of order to con-
22 sider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 115) providing
23 for the expenses of certain committees of the House of
24 Representatives in the One Hundred Thirteenth Congress.
25 The resolution shall be considered as read. The previous

1 question shall be considered as ordered on the resolution
2 to adoption without intervening motion or demand for di-
3 vision of the question except: (1) one hour of debate equal-
4 ly divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minor-
5 ity member of the Committee on House Administration;
6 and (2) one motion to recommit which may not contain
7 instructions.
