AN ACT

To remove the restriction on the distribution of certain revenues from the Mineral Springs parcel to certain members of the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. REMOVAL OF RESTRICTION ON DISTRIBUTION**
2 **OF CERTAIN REVENUES.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The fourth undesignated para-
4 graph in section 3(b) of the Act entitled “An Act to pro-
5 vide for the equalization of allotments on the Agua
6 Caliente (Palm Springs) Reservation in California, and for
7 other purposes” approved September 21, 1959 (25 U.S.C.
8 951 et seq.), is amended by striking “east: *Provided,*” and
9 all that follows through “deceased member.” and inserting
10 “east.”.

11 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
12 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to net rents, prof-
13 its, and other revenues that accrue on or after the date
14 of enactment of this Act.

15 (c) AGREEMENT TO MAKE PAYMENT.—The Congress
16 finds that the Agua Caliente Band of Mission Indians, in
17 Tribal Ordinance Number 22, dated August 6, 1996, has
18 agreed to make payments permitted by reason of the
19 amendment made by subsection (a). The Congress expects
20 the Band to make such payments within 180 days after
21 the date of enactment of this Act.
