Mr. RICHARDSON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To amend title V of Public Law 96–550, designating the Chaco Culture Archeological Protection Sites, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Chacoan Outliers
5 Protection Act of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. CONFORMING AMENDMENT.**

7 Section 501(b) of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C.
8 410ii(b)) is amended by striking “San Juan Basin;” and
9 inserting in lieu thereof, “San Juan Basin and surround-
10 ing areas;”.

1 **SEC. 3. ADDITIONS TO CHACO CULTURE ARCHEOLOGICAL**
 2 **PROTECTION SITES.**

3 Subsection 502(b) of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C.
 4 410ii–1(b)) is amended to read as follows:

5 “(b)(1) Thirty-nine outlying sites as generally de-
 6 picted on a map entitled ‘Chaco Culture Archeological
 7 Protection Sites’, numbered 310/80,033–B and dated Sep-
 8 tember 1991, are hereby designated as ‘Chaco Culture Ar-
 9 cheological Protection Sites’. The thirty-nine archeological
 10 protection sites totaling approximately 14,372 acres iden-
 11 tified as follows:

1 “(2) The map referred to in paragraph (1) shall be
2 kept on file and available for public inspection in the ap-
3 propriate offices of the National Park Service, the office
4 of the State Director of the Bureau of Land Management
5 located in Santa Fe, New Mexico, the office of the Area
6 Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs located in Win-
7 dow Rock, Arizona, and the offices of the Arizona and
8 New Mexico State Historic Preservation Officers.”.

9 **SEC. 4. ACQUISITIONS.**

10 Section 504(c)(2) of Public Law 96-550 (16 U.S.C.
11 410ii-3(c)(2)) is amended to read as follows:

12 “(2) The Secretary shall seek to use a combina-
13 tion of land acquisition authority under this section
14 and cooperative agreements (pursuant to section
15 505) to accomplish the purposes of archeological re-
16 source protection at those sites described in section
17 502(b) that remain in private ownership.”.

18 **SEC. 5. ASSISTANCE TO THE NAVAJO NATION.**

19 Section 506 of Public Law 96-550 (16 U.S.C. 410ii-
20 5) is amended by adding the following new subsection at
21 the end thereof:

1 “(f) The Secretary, acting through the Director of
2 the National Park Service, shall assist the Navajo Nation
3 in the protection and management of those Chaco Culture
4 Archeological Protection Sites located on lands under the
5 jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation through a grant, con-
6 tract, or cooperative agreement entered into pursuant to
7 the Indian Self-Determination and Education Act (Public
8 Law 93-638), as amended, to assist the Navajo Nation
9 in site planning, resource protection, interpretation, re-
10 source management actions, and such other purposes as
11 may be identified in such grant, contract, or cooperative
12 agreement. This cooperative assistance shall include as-
13 sistance with the development of a Navajo facility to serve
14 those who seek to appreciate the Chacoan Outlier Sites.”.

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
