## A BILL

To amend the Dayton Aviation Heritage Preservation Act of 1992, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That section 201(b) of the Dayton Aviation Heritage  
4       Preservation Act of 1992 (Public Law 102–419, approved  
5       October 16, 1992), is amended as follows:

1           (1) In paragraph (2), by striking “from rec-  
2           ommendations” and inserting “after consideration of  
3           recommendations”.

4           (2) In paragraph (4), by striking “from rec-  
5           ommendations” and inserting “after consideration of  
6           recommendations”.

7           (3) In paragraph (5), by striking “from rec-  
8           ommendations” and inserting “after consideration of  
9           recommendations”.

10          (4) In paragraph (6), by striking “from rec-  
11          ommendations” and inserting “after consideration of  
12          recommendations”.

13          (5) In paragraph (7), by striking “from rec-  
14          ommendations” and inserting “after consideration of  
15          recommendations”.
