A BILL

To eliminate the administrative authority to prohibit the possession or transfer of particular assault weapons.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ELIMINATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE AUTHORITY**

4 **TO PROHIBIT THE POSSESSION OR TRANS-**
5 **FER OF PARTICULAR ASSAULT WEAPONS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 921(a)(30) of title 18,
7 United States Code, is amended to read as follows:

8 “(30) The term ‘semiautomatic assault weapon’
9 means—

1 “(A) any firearm known as—

2 “(i) Norinco, Mitchell, and Poly Tech-
3 nologies Avtomat Kalashnikovs (all models);

4 “(ii) Action Arms Israeli Military Indus-
5 tries UZI and Galil;

6 “(iii) Beretta Ar70 (SC-70);

7 “(iv) Colt AR-15;

8 “(v) Fabrique National FN/FAL, FN/
9 LAR, and FNC;

10 “(vi) SWD M-10, M-11, M-11/9, and M-
11 12;

12 “(vii) Steyr AUG; or

13 “(viii) INTRATEC TEC-9, TEC-DC9
14 and TEC-22; and

15 “(B) any revolving cylinder shotgun, such as
16 (or similar to) the Street Sweeper and Striker 12.”.

17 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
18 subsection (a) shall take effect as if the amendment were
19 included in subtitle A of title XI of the Violent Crime Con-
20 trol and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 at the time such
21 subtitle became law.
