Mr. Goss, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 988) to reform the Federal civil justice system.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 988) to reform the Federal civil
6 justice system. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-
7 pensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill
8 and shall not exceed two hours equally divided and con-

1 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
2 the Committee on the Judiciary. After general debate the
3 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
4 minute rule for a period not to exceed seven hours. It shall
5 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose
6 of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment
7 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Commit-
8 tee on the Judiciary now printed in the bill. The committee
9 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be consid-
10 ered as read. During consideration of the bill for amend-
11 ment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may
12 accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether the
13 Member offering an amendment has caused it to be print-
14 ed in the portion of the Congressional Record designated
15 for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments
16 so printed shall be considered as read. At the conclusion
17 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
18 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
19 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
20 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
21 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
22 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
23 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
24 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without

- 1 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
- 2 or without instructions.
