Mr. SOLOMON from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Waiving points of order against the conference report to accompany the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 67) setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal years 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider the conference report to ac-
3 company the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 67) set-
4 ting forth the congressional budget for the United States
5 Government for the fiscal years 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999,

1 2000, 2001, and 2002. All points of order against the con-
2 ference report and against its consideration are waived.
3 The conference report shall be considered as read. The
4 conference report shall be debatable for one hour equally
5 divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-
6 nority member of the Committee on the Budget. The pro-
7 visions in section 2 of this resolution shall be effective
8 upon the adoption by the Congress of House Concurrent
9 Resolution 67.

10 **SEC. 2. HOUSE CONFORMING CHANGES.**

11 (a) REVENUE INSTRUCTION IN THE HOUSE.—For
12 the purposes of the compliance with reconciliation direc-
13 tions in the House under subsections (a), (b), and (c) of
14 section 310 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974,
15 subclause (II) of section 105(a)(2)(B)(xii) of the Concur-
16 rent Resolution on the Budget for Fiscal Year 1996 shall
17 be deemed to read as follows:

18 “(II) The House Committee on Ways
19 and Means shall report changes in laws
20 within its jurisdiction such that the total
21 level of revenues for that committee for fis-
22 cal year 2002 is not less than
23 \$1,295,840,000,000 and for fiscal years
24 1996 through 2002 is not less than
25 \$7,896,813,000,000.”.

1 (b) HOUSE CERTIFICATION PROCEDURE.—Section
2 205 of the Concurrent Resolution on the Budget for Fiscal
3 Year 1996 shall not apply with respect to the House.
