Ms. PRYCE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1977) making appropriations for the Department of the Interior and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 1977) making appropriations for
6 the Department of the Interior and related agencies for

1 the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, and for other
2 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
3 with. Points of order against consideration of the bill for
4 failure to comply with section 302(f), 306, or 308(a) of
5 the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. General
6 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed
7 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman
8 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appro-
9 priations. After general debate the bill shall be considered
10 for amendment under the five-minute rule. The bill shall
11 be considered by title rather than by paragraph. Each title
12 shall be considered as read. Points of order against provi-
13 sions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 or 6
14 of rule XXI are waived. The amendments printed in sec-
15 tion 2 of this resolution shall be considered as adopted
16 in the House and in the Committee of the Whole. All
17 points of order against the amendment printed in section
18 3 of this resolution are waived. During consideration of
19 the bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Committee
20 of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the
21 basis of whether the Member offering an amendment has
22 caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional
23 Record designated for that purpose in clause 6 of rule
24 XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered as
25 read. Points of order against amendments for failure to

1 comply with clause 2(e) of rule XXI are waived. At the
2 conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
3 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with
4 such amendments as may have been adopted. The previous
5 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
6 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
7 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
8 structions.

9 SEC. 2. The amendments considered as adopted in
10 the House and in the Committee of the Whole are as fol-
11 lows:

12 Page 57, line 21, strike “: *Provided further*”
13 and all that follows through “Act” on page 58, line
14 2.

15 Page 72, line 19, insert “, subject to passage
16 by the House of Representatives of a bill authorizing
17 such appropriation,” after the dollar figure.

18 Page 73, line 4, insert “, subject to passage by
19 the House of Representatives of a bill authorizing
20 such appropriation,” after the dollar figure.

21 Page 75, line 24, strike “equivalent to” and in-
22 sert “not to exceed”.

23 SEC. 3. The amendment against which all points of
24 order are waived is one offered by Representative Schaefer

1 of Colorado or Representative Tauzin of Louisiana as fol-
2 lows:

3 Page 57, line 9, strike “and” and all that fol-
4 lows through “Reserve” on line 21.

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
