Authorizing a specified correction in the form of the conference report to accompany the bill (H.R. 2491) to provide for reconciliation pursuant to section 105 of the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 1996, and waiving points of order against the corrected conference report.

Mr. DREIER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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RESOLUTION

Authorizing a specified correction in the form of the conference report to accompany the bill (H.R. 2491) to provide for reconciliation pursuant to section 105 of the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 1996, and waiving points of order against the corrected conference report.

1       *Resolved*, That the proceedings of the legislative day  
2 of November 15, 1995, by which the conference report to  
3 accompany the bill (H.R. 2491) to provide for reconcili-

1 ation pursuant to section 105 of the concurrent resolution  
2 on the budget for fiscal year 1996 was presented to the  
3 House and ordered printed, are hereby vacated, to the end  
4 that the managers on the part of the House may imme-  
5 diately present the conference report in the form actually  
6 ordered reported to the House as a product of the meeting  
7 and signatures of the committee of conference and actually  
8 to be presented in the Senate, in pertinent corrected part  
9 as depicted in section 3 of this resolution. The existing  
10 signatures of the committee of conference shall remain  
11 valid as authorizing the presentation of the conference re-  
12 port to the House in corrected form.

13       SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
14 in order to consider the conference report presented to the  
15 House pursuant to the first section of this resolution. All  
16 points of order against the conference report and against  
17 its consideration are waived. The conference report shall  
18 be considered as read. The conference report shall be de-  
19 batable for two hours equally divided and controlled by  
20 the chairman and ranking minority member of the Com-  
21 mittee on the Budget. After such debate the previous  
22 question shall be considered as ordered on the conference  
23 report to final adoption without intervening motion except  
24 one motion to recommit, which may not contain instruc-  
25 tions and on which the previous question shall be consid-

1 ered as ordered. After disposition of the conference report,  
2 no further consideration of the bill shall be in order except  
3 pursuant to a subsequent order of the House.

4 SEC. 3. The correction described in section 2 of this  
5 resolution is to insert between subtitles J and L of title  
6 XII a subtitle K (as depicted in the table of contents) as  
7 follows:

8 **“Subtitle K—Miscellaneous**

9 **“SEC. 13101. FOOD STAMP ELIGIBILITY.**

10 “Section 6(f) of the Food Stamp Act of 1977 (7  
11 U.S.C. 2015(f)) is amended by striking the third sentence  
12 and inserting the following: ‘The State agency shall, at  
13 its option, consider either all income and financial re-  
14 sources of the individual rendered ineligible to participate  
15 in the food stamp program under this subsection, or such  
16 income, less a pro rata share, and the financial resources  
17 of the ineligible individual, to determine the eligibility and  
18 the value of the allotment of the household of which such  
19 individual is a member.’

20 **“SEC. 13102. REDUCTION IN BLOCK GRANTS FOR SOCIAL**  
21 **SERVICES.**

22 “Section 2003(c) of the Social Security Act (42  
23 U.S.C. 1397b) is amended—

24 “(1) by striking ‘and’ at the end of paragraph  
25 (4); and

1           “(2) by striking paragraph (5) and inserting  
2           the following:

3           ‘(5) \$2,800,000,000 for each of the fiscal years  
4           1990 through 1996; and

5           ‘(6) \$2,240,000,000 for each fiscal year after  
6           fiscal year 1996.’”.



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
