Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3540) making appropriations for foreign operations, export financing, and related programs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3540) making appropriations for
6 foreign operations, export financing, and related programs

1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, and for
2 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-
3 pensed with. Points of order against consideration of the
4 bill for failure to comply with clause 1(b) of rule X or
5 clause 7 of rule XXI are waived. General debate shall be
6 confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally
7 divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-
8 nority member of the Committee on Appropriations. After
9 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
10 under the five-minute rule. The bill shall be considered
11 by title rather than by paragraph. Each title shall be con-
12 sidered as read. Points of order against provisions in the
13 bill for failure to comply with clause 2, 5(b), or 6 of rule
14 XXI are waived except as follows: beginning with “: *Pro-*
15 *vided*” on page 9, line 12, through “Appropriations” on
16 line 18; and beginning with “: *Provided*” on page 13, line
17 20, through “relocation” on page 14, line 5. Where points
18 of order are waived against part of a paragraph, points
19 of order against a provision in another part of such para-
20 graph may be made only against such provision and not
21 against the entire paragraph. During consideration of the
22 bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of
23 the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the basis
24 of whether the Member offering an amendment has caused
25 it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional Record

1 designated for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII.
2 Amendments so printed shall be considered as read. The
3 Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may postpone
4 until a time during further consideration in the Committee
5 of the Whole a request for a recorded vote on any amend-
6 ment. The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may
7 reduce to not less than five minutes the time for voting
8 by electronic device on any postponed question that imme-
9 diately follows another vote by electronic device without
10 intervening business, provided that the time for voting by
11 electronic device on the first in any series of questions
12 shall be not less than fifteen minutes. After the reading
13 of the final lines of the bill, a motion that the Committee
14 of the Whole rise and report the bill to the House with
15 such amendments as may have been adopted shall, if of-
16 fered by the majority leader or a designee, have precedence
17 over a motion to amend. At the conclusion of consideration
18 of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and
19 report the bill to the House with such amendments as may
20 have been adopted. The previous question shall be consid-
21 ered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to
22 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-
23 tion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
