

H. Res. 472

In the House of Representatives, U.S.,

July 10, 1996.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declared the House resolved into the Commit-
4 tee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for con-
5 sideration of the bill (H.R. 3755) making appropriations
6 for the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Serv-
7 ices, and Education, and related agencies, for the fiscal
8 year ending September 30, 1997, and for other purposes.
9 The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points
10 of order against consideration of the bill for failure to com-
11 ply with clause 2(l)(6) of rule XI, clause 7 of rule XXI,
12 or section 302 or 308 of the Congressional Budget Act
13 of 1974 are waived. General debate shall be confined to
14 the bill and shall not exceed two hours equally divided and
15 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
16 of the Committee on Appropriations. After general debate
17 the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
18 minute rule. Points of order against provisions in the bill

1 for failure to comply with clause 2 or 6 of rule XXI are
2 waived. During consideration of the bill for amendment,
3 the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may accord
4 priority in recognition on the basis of whether the member
5 offering an amendment has caused it to be printed in the
6 portion of the Congressional Record designated for that
7 purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed
8 shall be considered as read. The Chairman of the Commit-
9 tee of the Whole may postpone until a time during further
10 consideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for
11 a recorded vote on any amendment. The Chairman of the
12 Committee of the Whole may reduce to not less than five
13 minutes the time for voting by electronic device on any
14 postponed question that immediately follows another vote
15 by electronic device without intervening business, provided
16 that the time for voting by electronic device on the first
17 in any series of questions shall be not less than 15 min-
18 utes. After the reading of the final lines of the bill, a mo-
19 tion that the Committee of the Whole rise and report the
20 bill to the House with such amendments as may have been
21 adopted shall, if offered by the majority leader or a des-
22 ignee, have precedence over a motion to amend. At the
23 conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
24 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with
25 such amendments as may have been adopted. The previous

1 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
2 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
3 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
4 structions.
