Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3755) making appropriations for the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and related agencies, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declared the House resolved into the Commit-
4 tee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for con-
5 sideration of the bill (H.R. 3755) making appropriations

1 for the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Serv-
2 ices, and Education, and related agencies, for the fiscal
3 year ending September 30, 1997, and for other purposes.
4 The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points
5 of order against consideration of the bill for failure to com-
6 ply with clause 2(1)(6) of rule XI, clause 7 of rule XXI,
7 or section 302 or 308 of the Congressional Budget Act
8 of 1974 are waived. General debate shall be confined to
9 the bill and shall not exceed two hours equally divided and
10 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
11 of the Committee on Appropriations. After general debate
12 the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
13 minute rule. Points of order against provisions in the bill
14 for failure to comply with clause 2 or 6 of rule XXI are
15 waived. During consideration of the bill for amendment,
16 the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may accord
17 priority in recognition on the basis of whether the member
18 offering an amendment has caused it to be printed in the
19 portion of the Congressional Record designated for that
20 purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed
21 shall be considered as read. The Chairman of the Commit-
22 tee of the Whole may postpone until a time during further
23 consideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for
24 a recorded vote on any amendment. The Chairman of the
25 Committee of the Whole may reduce to not less than five

1 minutes the time for voting by electronic device on any
2 postponed question that immediately follows another vote
3 by electronic device without intervening business, provided
4 that the time for voting by electronic device on the first
5 in any series of questions shall be not less than 15 min-
6 utes. After the reading of the final lines of the bill, a mo-
7 tion that the Committee of the Whole rise and report the
8 bill to the House with such amendments as may have been
9 adopted shall, if offered by the majority leader or a des-
10 ignee, have precedence over a motion to amend. At the
11 conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
12 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with
13 such amendments as may have been adopted. The previous
14 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
15 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
16 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
17 structions.

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
