Ms. PRYCE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

---

## RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 665) to control crime by mandatory victim restitution.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 665) to control crime by mandatory  
6 victim restitution. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-  
7 pensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill  
8 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-

1 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of  
2 the Committee on the Judiciary. After general debate the  
3 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-  
4 minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original  
5 bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute  
6 rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-  
7 ommended by the Committee on the Judiciary now printed  
8 in the bill. The committee amendment in the nature of  
9 a substitute shall be considered as read. During consider-  
10 ation of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Com-  
11 mittee of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on  
12 the basis of whether the Member offering an amendment  
13 has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congres-  
14 sional Record designated for that purpose in clause 6 of  
15 rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered  
16 as read. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for  
17 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill  
18 to the House with such amendments as may have been  
19 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the  
20 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of  
21 the Whole to the bill or to the committee amendment in  
22 the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be  
23 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto  
24 to final passage without intervening motion except one  
25 motion to recommit with or without instruction.
