Mr. DIAZ-BALART, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 666) to control crime by exclusionary rule reform.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 666) to control crime by exclusion-
6 ary rule reform. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-
7 pensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill

1 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
2 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
3 the Committee on the Judiciary. After general debate the
4 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
5 minute rule. The bill shall be considered as read. During
6 consideration of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of
7 the Committee of the Whole may accord priority in rec-
8 ognition on the basis of whether the Member offering an
9 amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion of
10 the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in
11 clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be
12 considered as read. At the conclusion of consideration of
13 the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and re-
14 port the bill to the House with such amendments as may
15 have been adopted. The previous question shall be consid-
16 ered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to
17 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-
18 tion to recommit.
