**[Report No. 104-26]**

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 668) to control crime by further streamlining deportation of criminal aliens.

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IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. SOLOMON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 668) to control crime by further streamlining deportation of criminal aliens.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 668) to control crime by further  
6 streamlining deportation of criminal aliens. The first read-  
7 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points of order  
8 against consideration of the bill for failure to comply with

1 section 302(f) or section 303(a) of the Congressional  
2 Budget Act of 1974 are waived. General debate shall be  
3 confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally  
4 divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-  
5 nority member of the Committee on the Judiciary. After  
6 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment  
7 under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider  
8 as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under  
9 the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-  
10 stitute recommended by the Committee on the Judiciary  
11 now printed in the bill, modified by the amendment print-  
12 ed in section 2 of this resolution. All points of order  
13 against the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-  
14 stitute for failure to comply with clause 5(a) of rule XXI  
15 are waived. Each section of the committee amendment in  
16 the nature of a substitute, as modified, shall be considered  
17 as read. During consideration of the bill for amendment,  
18 the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may accord  
19 priority in recognition on the basis of whether the Member  
20 offering an amendment has caused it to be printed in the  
21 portion of the Congressional Record designated for that  
22 purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed  
23 shall be considered as read. At the conclusion of consider-  
24 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise  
25 and report the bill to the House with such amendments

1 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a  
2 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted  
3 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the commit-  
4 tee amendment in the nature of a substitute, as modified.  
5 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on  
6 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without  
7 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with  
8 or without instructions.

9       SEC. 2. The amendment in the nature of a substitute  
10 recommended by the Committee on the Judiciary now  
11 printed in the bill is modified by the following amendment:  
12 “Strike section 11 and redesignate the succeeding sections  
13 accordingly.”.

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
