## RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 1022) to provide regulatory reform and to focus national economic resources on the greatest risks to human health, safety, and the environment through scientifically objective and unbiased risk assessments and through the consideration of costs and benefits in major rules, and or other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of

1 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
2 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
3 ation of the bill (H.R. 1022) to provide regulatory reform  
4 and to focus national economic resources on the greatest  
5 risks to human health, safety, and the environment  
6 through scientifically objective and unbiased risk assess-  
7 ments and through the consideration of costs and benefits  
8 in major rules, and for other purposes. The first reading  
9 of the bill shall be dispensed with. General debate shall  
10 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed two hours  
11 equally divided among and controlled by the chairmen and  
12 ranking minority members of the Committee on Commerce  
13 and the Committee on Science. After general debate the  
14 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-  
15 minute rule for a period not to exceed ten hours and shall  
16 be considered as read. At the conclusion of consideration  
17 of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and  
18 report the bill to the House with such amendments as may  
19 have been adopted. The previous question shall be consid-  
20 ered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to  
21 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-  
22 tion to recommit.
