## RESOLUTION

To authorize and direct each standing committee of the House with subject matter jurisdiction over laws under which Federal agencies prescribe rules and regulations to report legislation during this session of Congress which would have the effect of streamlining those rules and regulations, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That each standing committee of the House  
2 with subject matter jurisdiction over laws under which  
3 Federal agencies prescribe rules and regulations is author-  
4 ized and directed to report legislation during this session  
5 of Congress—

1           (1) which would have the effect of causing those  
2 agencies to amend or repeal those rules and regula-  
3 tions in order to—

4           (A) reduce the cost of regulatory compli-  
5 ance to State and local governments and the  
6 private sector;

7           (B) reduce or eliminate unfunded or par-  
8 tially funded Federal mandates on State and  
9 local governments and the private sector;

10          (C) streamline administrative processes;

11          (D) require cost-benefit analyses and risk  
12 assessments; and

13          (E) require periodic reassessment of those  
14 rules and regulations;

15          (2) to eliminate or consolidate Federal agencies  
16 and other Federal entities; and

17          (3) to amend those laws to require their peri-  
18 odic reassessment.
