Mrs. MALONEY of New York (for herself, Mr. HORN, Mr. BARTLETT of Maryland, Mr. WATTS of Oklahoma, Ms. DUNN, Ms. WOOLSEY, Ms. SLAUGHTER, Mr. CALVERT, Mr. GIBBONS, Mr. MEEHAN, Mr. DELAHUNT, and Mr. GUTIERREZ) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that former Secretary General of the United Nations Kurt Waldheim should not receive a retirement allowance from the United Nations.

Whereas former Secretary General of the United Nations Kurt Waldheim currently receives an annual pension of \$102,000 from that body;

Whereas in 1986 Waldheim was exposed for his collaboration in the Nazi extermination campaign in southern Europe during World War II and he was barred from the United States;

Whereas Waldheim is a known Nazi war criminal who obtained his position at the United Nations under false pretenses;

Whereas because of this, the United Nations should no longer be obligated to fund a retirement allowance for Kurt Waldheim: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress that the
3 President should instruct the Permanent Representative
4 of the United States to the United Nations to act to
5 amend the 1998–99 Regular Program Budget of the
6 United Nations to eliminate funding of Kurt Waldheim’s
7 retirement allowance and to act to deny Kurt Waldheim
8 a retirement allowance in all future budgets of the United
9 Nations.
