- 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
- 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
- 3 That, effective with respect to any cause of action arising,
- 4 before, on, or after the date of the enactment of this Act,

1 section 1605(a)(7)(B)(ii) of title 28, United States Code,
2 is amended by striking “the claimant or victim was not”
3 and inserting “neither the claimant nor the victim was”.
