A BILL

To provide financial assistance for higher education to the dependents of Federal, State, and local public safety officers who are killed or permanently and totally disabled as the result of a traumatic injury sustained in the line of duty.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Police, Fire, and
5 Emergency Officers Educational Assistance Act of 1998”.

1 **SEC. 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR HIGHER EDUCATION**
2 **TO DEPENDENTS OF PUBLIC SAFETY OFFI-**
3 **CERS KILLED OR PERMANENTLY AND TO-**
4 **TALLY DISABLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.**

5 Part L of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe
6 Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796 et seq.) is amend-
7 ed—

8 (1) in the heading for subpart 2, by striking
9 **“Civilian Federal Law Enforcement”** and
10 inserting **“Public Safety”**;

11 (2) in section 1211(l), by striking “civilian Fed-
12 eral law enforcement” and inserting “public safety”;

13 (3) in section 1212(a)(1)(A), by striking “Fed-
14 eral law enforcement” and inserting “public safety”;

15 (4) in section 1216(a), by striking “Federal law
16 enforcement” and inserting “public safety”.

17 (5) in section 1217—

18 (A) by striking paragraph (2); and

19 (B) by redesignating paragraphs (3) and

20 (4) as (2) and (3), respectively.
