RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that
American families deserve tax relief.

Whereas American families currently pay too much of their
hard-earned money in taxes;

Whereas every American will work for at least 120 days in
1997 to pay his or her share of taxes;

Whereas Americans should be allowed to keep more of their
money to invest in their childrens' futures, purchase
homes, or start businesses; and

Whereas the American family will be strengthened by provid-
ing tax relief: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives urges
2 that the Congress and the President work together to
3 enact permanent tax relief for our Nation's families.
