Mr. SOLOMON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3) to combat violent youth crime and increase accountability for juvenile criminal offenses.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3) to combat violent youth crime  
6 and increase accountability for juvenile criminal offenses.  
7 The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. Gen-

1 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not ex-  
2 ceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair-  
3 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on  
4 the Judiciary. After general debate the bill shall be consid-  
5 ered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall  
6 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose  
7 of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment  
8 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Commit-  
9 tee on the Judiciary now printed in the bill. The committee  
10 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be consid-  
11 ered as read. Points of order against the committee  
12 amendment in the nature of a substitute for failure to  
13 comply with clause 5(a) of rule XXI are waived. No  
14 amendment to the committee amendment in the nature  
15 of a substitute shall be in order except those printed in  
16 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this  
17 resolution. Each amendment may be considered only in  
18 the order printed in the report, may be offered only by  
19 a Member designated in the report, shall be considered  
20 as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the  
21 report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and  
22 an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment except  
23 as specified in the report, and shall not be subject to a  
24 demand for division of the question in the House or in  
25 the Committee of the Whole. The Chairman of the Com-

1 mittee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during  
2 further consideration in the Committee of the Whole a re-  
3 quest for a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) re-  
4 duce to five minutes the minimum time for electronic vot-  
5 ing on any postponed question that follows another elec-  
6 tronic vote without intervening business, provided that the  
7 minimum time for electronic voting on the first in any se-  
8 ries of questions shall be fifteen minutes. At the conclusion  
9 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee  
10 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such  
11 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may  
12 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment  
13 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to  
14 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.  
15 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on  
16 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without  
17 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with  
18 or without instructions.
